Supervisor Status Annual Renewal Requirements

To continue to be recognised as an NLPtCA supervisor you should meet the following requirements:

1. Be a UKCP registered Psychotherapist and Accredited by NLPtCA. Be registered with NLPtCA as a supervisor.
2. Be a fully paid-up member with NLPtCA, and have paid all fees for accreditation and UKCP registration.
3. Adhere to the NLPtCA Code of Ethics and Practice for the Supervision of Psychotherapists and Counsellors, and therefore be subject to a Complaints Procedure.
4. Be in supervision for the practice of supervision, separate from client case supervision. (See Supervision Policy and Guidelines for guidance on ratios).
 - a. Trainee supervisors should receive at least one hour of supervision of supervision for ten hours of supervision given to others during training.
 - b. Accredited supervisors should contract with their supervisor to agree the amount of supervision of their supervision. A suggested ratio is one hour of supervision of supervision for twenty hours of supervision given.
5. Public Liability and Malpractice insurance cover must be maintained at all times for the activity of supervision.
6. Supervisors are responsible for maintaining and developing their skills through appropriate Continued Professional Development. (For details see the NLPtCA CPD Policy for Accredited Members)
7. Supervisors are responsible for following NLPtCA and UKCP guidelines relating to the amount of remote working allowed with individual supervisees
8. Supervisors are responsible for immediately informing, in writing, the *designated representative of NLPtCA who oversees supervision* of any complaints or criminal charges brought against you, or any complaint made that is relevant to counselling, psychotherapy or supervision, be that directly by a client, or through any UKCP section or other professional body.
